



- Placer County Sisley Road Update: the first choice was to pave over the entire road, and the second choice was to overlay a portion and preserve a 50' section.
- El Dorado County Country Club Drive Expansion Project: Moe Mohanna contacted me before Christmas to inform me of this project. I contacted the El Dorado County Public Works Department, the Board of Supervisors, Senator Maria Alvarado Gil, and Assembly Member Joe Patterson. The project is in its early stages, and the chapter will be contacted for input.
- Emigrant Gap Lincoln Highway Marker: Jim Guida has contacted the chapter about posting a replica Lincoln Highway Marker along Laing Road, near the location of the former Rancho Sierra Inn Emigrant Gap Historical Marker. The project will start after the California Conference, plus record-setting snow melts, allowing the site to be located and marker planted. A local Boy Scout troop will be contacted to help with the project.

• **Future Chapter Meetings.** Finding locations for chapter meetings will have its challenges due to inflation; menu prices have increased 8% at restaurants in the last year. It will be difficult to locate a place for lunch and our meeting and stay in the former price range. So I continue to ask for suggestions from members.

• Citrus Heights Points of Interest & LH signage request: California chapter member Andy Saunders contacted the board requesting that the 12 Mile House and the 14 Mile House in Citrus Heights be added to our official map. Map chairman Paul Gilger updated the map with Andy's suggestions. Andy introduced these additions at a Citrus Heights City Council Meeting and will hopefully be able to move on to a signage project on Auburn Boulevard, placing Historic Lincoln Highway signs at specific locations. LH banners on Auburn Boulevard have been taken down.

Sernhard Museum, Auburn

The Chapter was invited by the Placer County Museums to hold our winter meeting at the historic Bernhard Museum. It is one of seven museums operated by the Placer County Museums. According to the museum website:

Built in 1851 as the Traveler's Rest Hotel, the Bernhard House has welcomed visitors for over 150 years. Filled with artifacts and furnishings from a bygone era, the Bernhard House transports visitors to a simpler time. The Bernhard Museum also serves as home to the third-grade Living History Program.

The Bernhard House is one of the oldest buildings in Placer County.



Our host for the meeting was Ralph Gibson, Administrator for the Placer County Museums. He gave us a brief history of the historic house and was kind enough to let us use the adjoining historic winery for our meeting.

The meeting was attended by over 26 people, which was a good turnout for a rainy day.

Andrew Saunders from Citrus Heights attended his first meeting and mentioned how he was working with the city to see the historic 12 Mile House preserved and registered as a



landmark. The 12 Mile House was a rest stop dating back to the 19th Century and sits on the Citrus Heights section of the Lincoln Highway. We hope to work with Andrew on erecting our historic Lincoln Highway signs along the Citrus Heights route.
