

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

Our summer chapter meeting is on July 9 at the Old 40 Bar and Grill at Donner Ski Ranch. The grill is an excellent venue, as right outside the door is California's most historic square mile. The Donner Ski Ranch is a landmark as one of California's earliest ski resorts, and Sugar Bowl is another pioneer ski resort just down the road.

Our October chapter meeting will be held at another historic summit, at Johnson Pass. The California Alpine Club is our host. You don't want to miss this meeting, as we will be able to view the inside of the building, which is situated on a

sheer cliff looking down upon Lake Tahoe. The building was originally a Forest Service lookout for visitors traveling the southern route of the Lincoln Highway through

California. The building was then leased to Theodore Clemens Wohlbrück (1879–1936), known as "T.C." Wohlbrück, who enlarged the building for what he called a "canteen" service station. The building today still includes some of T.C.'s handmade furniture. The color photo shows the lodge as it is today. It still has a Lincoln Highway sign!


The National Lincoln Highway Conference for 2023 will be in our state! Our committee is starting the preparation by choosing a hotel near Folsom. We are currently working with the Lake Natoma Inn, which would be a great location along the Lincoln Highway and near Folsom's historic district. If you are interested in helping prepare for the conference, contact Joel or me.

I've contacted the family of our former editor, Gary Kinst, to seek their permission to help get Gary's book about the Lincoln Highway in California published. It was a dream of Gary's, and we would like to see it come to fruition. I have a contact at Arcadia Publishing, so we are moving ahead, albeit a bit slowly. Some of you have donated money to see the book published, and I'll keep you abreast of developments.





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Summer has arrived, schools are in recess, and families are packing up for vacations. The California Chapter returns to Donner Summit for our Summer Chapter Meeting on Saturday, July 9. This will be a great opportunity to cool off in the high mountain air while exploring California's most historic square mile. The chapter meeting will be held at Old 40 Bar and Grill located at the Donner Ski Ranch at Donner Summit.

- 1. On **June 12–20**, **the Eastern Third Tour**, the first of three tours that follow the final 1928 alignment of the Lincoln Highway, took place. Tour guides Paul Gilger and Jim Cassler lead group members from New York to Joliet, Illinois. Stopping at numerous historical sites along the road was a fun-packed adventure. Paul Gilger will present the tour during our summer chapter meeting.
- 2. The Illinois chapter hosted the annual conference in Joliet from June 20–24, after a three-year absence due to the pandemic. Besides the Lincoln Highway, attendees were could also explore the Dixie Highway (another brainchild of Carl Fisher) and Route 66, which connected Chicago to Los Angeles and was a primary route for those who migrated west, especially during the Dust Bowl of the 1930s. It was recognized in popular culture by the 1946 hit song "Get Your Kicks on Route 66."


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3. **Next year, California will host the 2023 national conference.** Our committee is currently working on the agenda, which will include bus tours of Donner and Echo Summit alignments of the Lincoln. There will also be self-guided driving tours, one before the conference from the Western Terminus Marker in San Francisco to Folsom, and one after from Folsom to the Duarte Garage in Livermore. The Folsom—Rancho Cordova area will host the conference. The awards dinner will be held at the Mohanna Ranch and Event Center, which also hosted the Lincoln Highway 100th Anniversary California Dinner in 2013. Other details are still in progress.

- 4. Lake Slow Street project in San Francisco: There are no additional updates from my last report. We are currently waiting for a response from the city to install a Lincoln Highway History plaque.
- 5. "L" California Chapter roadway painting project: Monica Pitsenberger is working on the stencil, which will be used on concrete alignments in El Dorado and Placer Counties. We are waiting for replies from Caltrans and local county public works departments for painting "L" along alignments under state or county control.
- 6. **Echo Summit Lodge:** The October 8 chapter meeting will be held at the Echo Summit Lodge, currently managed by the California Alpine Club. We are researching having a food truck set up before the meeting, so we can enjoy lunch at the lodge.



As we head into summer, it's time to head back up-country to enjoy the fresh air and cooler temperatures. Our summer chapter meeting is being held at the Old 40 Bar and Grill at Donner Ski Ranch. A skier using a rope-tow at the Ranch, c. 1948


self historic, as it was one of the pioneering ski resorts in the west.

If you are a bit daring, there is a short hike up to the Donner Summit weather station site, part of the 1920s era Transcontinental Airway System. Before pilots had instruments for flying, they flew by what they could see. There were beacons and weather stations for guiding planes across the country.

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The Weather Station overlooking Donner Lake

Just below the weather station site is a small quarry that was used for building and repair of the highway. There is a "C" Monument in a most unlikely location. Can you see it in front of Monica in the photo below?



The weather can be so extreme on Donner Summit that steel cables were stretched over it and anchored to the granite when the weather station was built. That kept the building from blowing away.

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This photograph shows the first snow removal equipment on Donner Pass. These vehicles didn't work the Lincoln, but the early Highway 40, which followed the second-generation Lincoln Highway.





An automobile is headed down the grade at Donner Summit. This photograph was taken before the use of snow removal equipment. The snow was hand dug by eager merchants and others who were looking for the first customer to come over the summit.

To the right is a fantastic shot of a couple of automobiles headed down into the auto subway under the Southern Pacific tracks next to the China Wall. The snow looks dirty, as the very same people who hand-dug the snow would bring ash and coal dust to sprinkle on the snow in an attempt to help it melt faster.



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What looks like the Rainbow Bridge is the scaffolding for the new bridge. The actual height of the bridge will reach those two abutments we see towards the top of the photo.

Here is a cool photograph of the


construction of the Rainbow Bridge. We can see the new bridge, the approaching roads, and if you look very closely at the very bottom right, an automobile headed up by the small pond and using the original alignment of the Lincoln Highway, since the bridge is not yet complete. The small pond the car is passing was formed

by the construction of the second-generation Lincoln, which blocked its outflow.



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A beautiful postcard photograph is showing the newly completed second-generation Lincoln Highway bridge, complete with dirt approaches, which changed to asphalt when the road became Highway 40. The plaque pictured used to be at the lookout point near the bridge. It now rests at the Donner Summit Historical Society.

There was a time...

Enjoy these advertisements from a news article in the Sacramento Bee, July 1916. At this time, the state highway department did not plow the roads up and over the two California summits. You had to wait for the spring melt before attempting to cross the mountains. Heading up to the resorts was quite a trip, and the various resorts did their best to lure the new auto traveler. These are some advertisements for resorts and camps along the southern or Pioneer route of the Lincoln Highway in California. (\$1 in 1916 is worth about \$27 in 2022.)
