

Our October Chapter meeting is at be held at the historic summit of Johnsons Pass on October 1. The Alpine Club is our host, and you don't want to miss this meeting, as we will

be able to view the inside of the building, which is situated on a sheer cliff looking down upon Lake Tahoe. The building was originally a Forest Service lookout for visitors traveling the



southern route of the Lincoln Highway through

California. The building was then leased to Theodore Clemens Wohlbrück (1879–1936), known as "T.C.", who enlarged the building for what he called a "canteen" service station. Today it still includes some of T.C.'s handmade furniture. The color photo shows the lodge as it is today. It still has a Lincoln Highway sign!

Our Chapter is hosting the 2003 National Convention under the theme, "California, Here We Come!" Our host city will be Folsom, along the American River. We are working on having a great lineup of speakers, as well as some great tours of both the northern and southern routes of the Lincoln Highway.

The 1913 alignment of the southern route in California passes directly in front of the store.






Echo Summit Lodge at Johnson's Pass

The early autoist would have finally reached Johnson's Pass after climbing up the steep Meyer's Grade from the Tahoe valley floor. These old autos would need supplies like water and oil once they reached the summit, as they were constantly leaking or burning up fluids. Fortunately, entrepreneur T.C. Wohlbrück had built an early service station and food stop that he called a "canteen." While there had been a small forest service cabin here, T.C. added to it, creating the building we see in the above photo.

To the left is a rare photograph of the inside of the Echo Summit Canteen. Everything seen in the photo was hand made by T.C. Apparently, some of the furniture is inside the present Alpine Club Lodge, which occupies the site today.

While enjoying a break from the road, you could head out back and check out the magnificent view, as seen at right.





A close up of the proceeding photograph shows the signs attached to a directional device: "Please Register at Lodge" and "Make your post cards from the top of the world, Echo Summit..."



This photograph shows the lodge as approached from the west. Immediately after the lodge, the road drops down a very steep and twisting portion of Meyers Grade headed towards Lake Tahoe. While looking at the photograph through a magnifier, I noticed the sign on the right, which is a Lincoln Highway sign, guiding the traveler along the "highway."

When the State of California built the current Highway 50 alignment, it bypassed this historic spot for the current route around Echo Summit. The business soon declined, and in 1952 the Alpine Club purchased the lodge and still runs it today. There is a new Lincoln Highway sign, which still stands, attached to the building by the stairs.
